Background of SOR



National State Opioid Response (SOR) Initiative:

- Purpose: To address the overdose crisis, primarily driven by illicit fentanyl, in part by:
 - Increasing access to medications for OUD treatment and supporting prevention, harm reduction, treatment, and recovery services.
 - Providing resources to states and territories for evidence-based treatments, practices, and interventions for OUD and STUD.

DSAMH's SOR Initiative

- DSAMH's State Opioid Response 4.0 (SOR) project is a statewide initiative to enhance and further develop its opioid and stimulant disorder (OUD/STUD) system of care for all Delawareans while dedicating focused efforts on six key populations:
- Pregnant and parenting people
- Racial/ethnic minorities
- Individuals in high-need zip codes
- LGBTQ+ populations
- Justice-involved populations
- School-aged youth

PROGRAM PURPOSE



To support grassroots organizations in developing and implementing messaging campaigns or educational programs that reduce stigma associated with OUD and STUD. The goal is to increase awareness, deliver education and reduce stigma related to OUD and STUD among key populations at both the local and state-wide levels.

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Grassroots Messaging and Awareness Campaign (GMAC) Overview

What is GMAC?

• A DSAMH initiative to award SOR funding for strategic messaging campaigns with anti-stigma and OUD/ STUD education and awareness messaging.

How is GMAC funded?

- DSAMH's SOR 4 grant is funded by the U.S. Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA).
- This solicitation describes available funding for grassroots opioid use disorder (OUD) and Stimulant Use Disorder (STUD) anti-stigma education and awareness efforts and is available to eligible organizations for the period of March 2025 through September 29, 2025.

GMAC: What Organizations are Eligible?



ELIGIBLE APPLICANTS

- Non-profit, community-based health and human service organizations (e.g., social services, religious organizations, food banks) that can reach underserved or hard-to-reach individuals with anti-stigma and OUD/STUD prevention messaging.
- Local health and human services providers that serve individuals with OUD/STUD.

ORGANIZATIONAL REQUIREMENTS

- Current State of Delaware Business License (from Division of Revenue)
 or IRS 501(c)3 exemption verification
 - Valid Unique Entity Identifier (UEI)
 - Delaware eSupplier Number
 - Current Certificate of Liability
 Insurance Coverage
 - Current Employer Identification Number (EIN)
 - Attach a screenshot of an active listing on SAM.GOV or evidence of application for SAM.GOV

GMAC: Funding Parameters



Award Amount

- Applicants may request <u>up to</u> \$30,000 for efforts focused at the local community or county level, or <u>up to</u> \$50,000 for campaigns intended to be implemented statewide.
- The proposed budget must match the level of effort by staff/contractors and the reasonable and appropriate costs associated with the scope of the project.
 - DSAMH reserves the right to make an award at a funding level that is reasonable and appropriate, different than what is requested in the application.
 - Applications with excessive funding requests not justified in the budget will be rejected and returned to the applicant for revision, delaying determination for an award.






GMAC Payment Structure

DATA REQUIREMENTS



- Applicants must identify at least three unique measures selected by your organization to track the impact of your project.
- Data metrics will vary based on the specifics of each proposed project and will be submitted to DSAMH monthly.
- Applicants must identify specific, measurable, and relevant data metrics for their project based on these key categories:
 - Engagement & Reach
 - Knowledge & Awareness
 - Community & Partnerships
 - Impact & Quality Improvement
 - Creative & Educational Projects

Health Equity Advancement Project (HEAP)



DSAMH is continuing the Health Equity Advancement Project (HEAP) initiative for a third year to support organizations to implement approaches to engage racial/ethnic minorities in Delaware who are impacted by OUD/STUD. The below opportunities are currently open and accepting applications.

Mini-Grants	Community Awareness Partnerships
Provides direct funding to treatment/recovery organizations and community-based organizations to implement foundational activities that better equip organizations to address the needs of racial/ethnic minorities impacted by OUD/STUD. <u>Application deadline is November 22, 2024</u> .	Provides in-kind support and resources to community-based organizations and community leaders to develop and implement community education/awareness campaign strategies addressing OUD/STUD, with a focus on reaching racial/ethnic minorities. Application deadline is December 5, 2024.
 HEAP TX: Up to \$75,000 per treatment/recovery organization to conduct equity-focused data analyses to inform program design that improves outcomes for vulnerable populations. HEAP CBO: Up to \$50,000 per CBO to build internal capacity to address OUD/STUD, develop and enhance referral pathways, and engage and convene community stakeholders. 	Community partners will have access to a Campaign Planner to assist in the design of a customized campaign, including but not limited to speaker's bureau, listening sessions, and social media campaigns. No direct funding will be provided, but DSAMH will purchase & provide in-kind materials and provide technical assistance to support implementation of the campaign.
